All personal details submitted to the Society are recorded:

- 1 On secure password protected computer files with anti-virus software as protection.
- 2 On paper which is stored in files in the homes of the Secretary and Treasurer. When not being used these files are securely stored.

We will only use this data with your consent and for choir administration, ie, the week to week running of the choir including rehearsals and concerts amongst Society officials and this data is not shared with any third parties.

Photographs may be used on various media including the Society website, but we will not use these photographs if you have expressly not consented to this. You may withdraw consent at any time on contacting the Secretary.

It is your responsibility to ensure that any changes to your personal details are communicated to us.

We will store this data for as long as you are a member, patron, or a paid supplier for only as long as is necessary. Depending upon your circumstances this maybe for a period of six years after your association with the Society has ended.

Your rights

You have the right to object to the way we use your personal data.

You may request a copy of your personal data that is held by the Society.

You have the right to correct your data and for us to erase your data.
